APPLICATION FOR A DECLARATION OF GENERAL RULING STATE WAGE CASE

SUBMISSIONS IN REPLY OF THE AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION OF EMPLOYEES, QUEENSLAND

- 1. The Applicant has read the submissions of the:
 - a. Queensland Government filed on 3 August 2020; and
 - b. Local Government Association Queensland filed on 13 August 2020.

QUEENSLAND GOVNERMENT

- 2. The Applicant understands that the Queensland Government supports:
 - a. a 1.75% increase to the Queensland Minimum Wage ('QMW'); and
 - b. an operative date of 1 September 2020.¹
- 3. The Queensland Government submission does not differ from the Applicant's submission in this regard.

- 4. However, the Applicant understands that the Queensland Government has made no submission as to whether an increase of 1.75% to Award rates of pays and allowances, but has instead left the matter for Queensland Industrial Relations Commission to decide.²
- 5. The Applicant submits that there should be a 1.75% increase to Award rates of pay and allowances. The Applicant relies upon our previous submission in this regard.
- 6. Further, the Queensland Government has not provided any arguments against an increase to the Award rates of pay and Allowances.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF QUEENSLAND

- 7. The Applicant understands the Local Government Association of Queensland supports a:
 - a. 1.75% increase to the QMW; and
 - b. 2% increase to Award rates of pay in particular circumstances.³
- 8. The Local Government Association of Queensland submission does not differ from the Applicant's submission in this regard, save for the submission in relation to a 2% increase to Award rates of pay.
- 9. It is somewhat of a unique situation where an employer organisation is advocating for a higher increase than an employee organisation, and the Applicant merely makes the submission that should the Commission make a finding that there is capacity in the Queensland economy to sustain a 2% increase to Award rates, the Applicant would support such a position.
- 10. However, the Applicant understands that the Local Government Association of Queensland does not support:
 - a. an increase to the allowances;⁴ and
 - b. an operative date of 1 1 September 2020.⁵
- 11. In response to the Local Government Association of Queensland's submissions, the Applicant submits that there should be a 1.75% increase to Award allowances.⁶

- 12. The Applicant submits that the Award allowances should increase by 1.75% irrespective of the decision to increase Award rates of pay (whether by the 1.75% sought by the Applicant or the 2% sought by the Local Government Association of Queensland).
- 13. With respect to the operative date, all other parties involved in this matter have put forward a submission for an operative date of 1 September 2020.
- 14. The operative date of the increase has traditionally been 1 September, and the Applicant is seeking a continuation of that operative date in 2020.

CONCLUSION

- 15. For the avoidance of any doubt, the Applicant is seeking:
 - a. 1.75% increase to the QMW;
 - b. 1.75% increase to all Award allowances; and
 - c. 1.75% increase to all Award rates of pay, if not the 2% increase sought by the Local Government Association of Queensland.
- 16. Further, that the operative date for the items stipulated at paragraph nine be 1 September 2020.
